EAL/D Parent Information Session - Independent Reading for children at home

On Wednesday 21 September 2016 we held an information session for some of our parents for whom English is not their first language. The topic of the session was the importance of Independent Reading for children at home. Lisa Tantiprasut, one of our EAL teachers and year 4 class teacher, spoke passionately to parents about how they can help their children engage with books at home, even if they don't speak or read English themselves. We had our best turn out ever, with over 25 parents attending. It was especially lovely to see the parents of so many of our older children coming along to see how they can support their children. Each parent was able to take home some library membership forms in order to be able to access this valuable local resource, as well as some bilingual bookmarks with questions to help discuss the books their children are reading at home. EAL/D Parent Information Session – Road Safety 15 June 2017

As part of a series of road safety talks happening around the school, a parent information session took place this morning for our EAL parents. A guest speaker from the RAC gave lots of information on pedestrian, car and bike safety. The parents were also informed of some of our laws in Western Australia which are timely for everyone to be reminded of with the holidays coming closer:

- All children under the age of 7 should be sitting in an approved child restraint in the back seat of the car.
- Children under 12 should not be sitting in the front seat of a car, unless all the back seats are filled with younger children.
- All children and adults must wear a bike helmet when cycling.
- Children under 10 should not be cycling or walking to school alone. Older children should be accompanying younger siblings under the age of 10 to school.
- Children under 10 should not be crossing the road by themselves.
- It is not permitted to text while driving and drivers are strongly recommended not to take calls, even hands free, while driving.
- It is also recommended not to listen to music while walking or cycling as it reduces your capacity to be alert to the traffic around you.

Thank you to the parents who attended, I know they found the session very useful and are keen to have it repeated next year.
