FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Last week the school had its first positive case of COVID in two of our classes. I would like to extend my appreciation to the parents and carers of these classes and how promptly, positively and in most cases with good humour when they came to school to collect their child. From a schools perspective we are quite pleased that our processes worked. All students affected had access to distant learning packages. We would appreciate any feedback in this space, as moving forward, this is one area we want to ensure we get correct. On this occasion, students only missed just over two days of learning so disruption to programs was minimal.

Students returned on Wednesday 9th March with no other students testing positive. Classrooms have been thoroughly cleaned in preparation of students returning. As a school, we expect to get further positive cases. Our response will be determined by current guidelines provided by the Health and Education Departments. These are constantly changing. We are endeavouring to manage the impact of COVID using a common sense approach and not over reacting. At the end of the day, we want to ensure ALL students, staff are as safe as possible in the current environment, and disruptions to learning programs are as minimal as possible. We are trying to keep the students school environment as 'normal' as possible!

Three Way Conferences

This is one reason we would like to go ahead with the Three Way Conferences on Wednesday 30th March. Next week parents will be able to book online to make an appointment to discuss their child/ren's progress and how they have settled in to the 2022 school year. A link will be sent to parents. Parents need to be aware of the following:

- All meetings will be by phone
- This year they will be more teacher parent interviews than parent / teacher, child (however we encourage you to have your child listen in)
- Teachers will call you on the number we have on our database, so if this is not up to date, please contact the front office.
- Interviews will be for approx. 10 minutes
- Interpreters will be available for families that require this service.
- The focus of the meetings will be literacy, numeracy and student well being
- Meetings will be available from 11:00am 5:45 pm
- Some families may also be contacted by our specialist teachers

Students need to be collected from school by 10:40am on Wednesday 30th March. Helping Hands are available if you need your child supervised.

Assemblies

We have commenced holding paired back assemblies virtually. At this stage no class items are occurring. The National Anthem and School song is still sung and students are acknowledged for their hard work via merit certificates, values awards and specialist awards. Our student councillors and faction captains are adjusting well to the new delivery mode.



School Health Nurse

School Entry Health Assessment

All children in Western Australia are eligible for a School Entry Health Assessment when they are of school entry age. The School Entry Health Assessment is provided by the local School Health Nurse. It is an excellent opportunity to look at the health and development of your child at the beginning of school life.

The assessments are simple, non-invasive, quick and easy. They screen for problems, which are best addressed, if picked up and treated early. The assessments include:

- Vision
- Hearing
- Growth (including weight, height and Body Mass Index).

Your child's results will be sent home after their health check has been completed. Results are always treated confidentially. Please note, if the assessment results for your child suggest there may be a concern, the School Health Nurse will contact you to discuss.

School Entry Health Assessment forms are currently being distributed for parents to complete.

Please complete and sign the back page of the form before you return it.

Please return the form to the class teacher as soon as possible.

In 2022 Parent-Teacher phone interviews will be held for Kindy through to Year 6.

School will finish at recess time 10.40am on this day.

Phone interviews will occur:

- Wednesday 30th March 2022
- From 11:00am 6:00pm
- Interviews will be 10 minutes long
- Conversations will focus on literacy, numeracy and student well being
- The classroom teacher will contact you based on the number you provide when you book your interview
- Interpreters will be available to assist families if required
- Students are welcome to listen
- If a longer meeting is required, a further meeting can be organised for another day and time.

Interviews will be of 10-minute duration.

PTO will be open for bookings on Wednesday 16th March at 4.00pm

Using this system, you will be able to book the interview times that suit you best from any internet-connected computer.

Use Google Chrome, Safari, Microsoft Edge or Mozilla Firefox as search engines.

Click "Obtain PIN/Password" and enter your email address. Your PIN will be emailed to you. The email you
receive will include a link that can be clicked on to log straight into PTO, bypassing the login screen.

If you are having problems with receiving your pin, please contact the office and we will assist you.

Full instructions are provided to you after log in. Please note the following points:

- . When you log on, the system displays only your own child/children.
- You will only see time slots that are available at the time you are using the system. As time slots are booked
 for teachers, those time slots are no longer displayed as available. PTO prevents double-booking of teachers
 or parents/guardians.
- When you have made all the bookings you require, you can download or email a report of your bookings in time order for printing. You can log in and change bookings any time up to 4.00pm Friday 25th March.
- If you see this symbol displayed alongside the class name, it means this teacher recommends that you book an interview.
- Other parents may be making bookings at the same time that you are using the system. It is possible, though
 unlikely, that a time slot is displayed to you as available, but is then booked by another parent shortly
 afterwards. If you then attempt to book this time slot it will not be available and a message will be displayed to
 indicate this.

NAPLAN - 2022

Tuesday 10th May to Friday 20th May 2022

NAPLAN information for parents and carers



Why do students do NAPLAN?

NAPLAN is a national literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit in May each year. It is the only national assessment all Australian students do.

As students progress through their school years, it's important to check how well they are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and numeracy.

NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through the school curriculum and allows parents/carers to see how their child is progressing against national standards and over time.

NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process. It doesn't replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance, but it can provide teachers with additional information about students' progress.

NAPLAN also provides schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are achieving important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.

Your child will do the NAPLAN tests online

Schools are transitioning from paper-based to computer-based assessments. Most schools will complete NAPLAN tests online in 2022. All Year 3 students will continue to complete the writing assessment on paper.

Online NAPLAN tests provide more precise results and are more engaging for students. One of the main benefits is tailored (or adaptive) testing, where the test presents questions which may be more or less difficult depending on a student's responses.

Tailored testing allows a wider range of student abilities to be assessed and measures student achievement more precisely. A student's overall NAPLAN result is based on both the number and complexity of questions they answer correctly. Your child should not be concerned if they find questions challenging; they may be taking a more complex test pathway.

What does NAPLAN assess?

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through their regular school curriculum.

Students sit assessments in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. Questions assess content linked to the Australian Curriculum: English and Mathematics.

All government and non-government education authorities have contributed to the development of NAPLAN test materials.

Participation in NAPLAN

NAPLAN is for everyone. ACARA supports inclusive testing so all students can participate in the national assessment program.

Adjustments are available for students with disability who have diverse functional abilities and needs.

Schools should work with parents/carers and students to identify, on a case-by-case basis, reasonable adjustments required for individual students with disability to access NAPLAN. Adjustments should reflect the support normally provided for classroom assessments.

To help inform these decisions, you may consult the NAPLAN public demonstration site, the Guide for schools to assist students with disability to access NAPLAN, or our series of videos where parents/carers, teachers and students share their experience of using NAPLAN adjustments.

In exceptional circumstances, a student with a disability that severely limits their capacity to participate in the assessment, or a student who has recently arrived in Australia and has a non-English speaking background, may be granted a formal exemption.

Your school principal and your local test administration authority can give you more information on adjustments for students with disability or the process required to gain a formal exemption.









NAPLAN - 2022

What if my child is absent from school on NAPLAN days?

Where possible, schools may arrange for individual students who are absent at the time of testing to complete missed tests at another time during the school's test schedule.

What can I do to support my child?

Students are not expected to study for NAPLAN.

You can support your child by reassuring them that NAPLAN is a part of their school program and reminding them to simply do their best.

ACARA does not recommend excessive preparation for NAPLAN or the use of services by coaching providers,

Some familiarisation and explanation of NAPLAN is useful to help students understand and be comfortable with the format of the tests. Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the types of questions in the tests and will provide appropriate support and guidance.

NAPLAN timetable

The NAPLAN online test window is nine days. This is to accommodate schools that may have fewer devices.

The NAPLAN online test window starts on Tuesday 10 May and finishes on Friday 20 May 2022. Tests must be scheduled as soon as possible within the testing window, prioritising the first week.

Online NAPLAN test scheduling requirements are detailed in the table below.

How is my child's performance reported?

Individual student performance is shown on a national achievement scale for each assessment. A result at the national minimum standard indicates that the student has demonstrated the basic literacy and numeracy skills needed to participate fully in that year level.

A NAPLAN individual student report will be provided by your child's school later in the year. If you do not receive a report, you should contact your child's school.

How are NAPLAN results used?

- Students and parents/carers may use individual results to discuss progress with teachers.
- Teachers use results to help identify students who need greater challenges or extra support.
- Schools use results to identify strengths and areas of need to improve teaching programs, and to set goals in literacy and numeracy.
- School systems use results to review programs and support offered to schools.
- The community can see information about the performance of schools over time at myschool.edu.au

School Board Nominations - 2022

Nominations called to fill vacant positions on our School Board

As announced in today's Newsletter, the Bletchley Park Primary School Board is calling for nominations to fill two-parent / community positions, for a three-year tenure. Should we receive more than two nominations; an election process will then be conducted to fill the positions.

It is anticipated that new School Board members will commence later in Term 1 2022 and hold the position for three years. This is a wonderful opportunity to make a positive contribution to your child's school. The three main areas the school is focusing on in its Business Plan are Digital Technologies, Student Achievement and Quality Teaching. We are also eager to ensure the School Board represents our diverse school community.

The School Board has the following powers and duties:

To take part in:

- establishing and reviewing from time to time, the school's objectives, priorities and general policy directions;
- financial planning to support the above;
- evaluating the school's performance in achieving them; and
- formulating codes of conduct for students at the school;

To approve:

- charges, contributions and fees; extra cost optional components of the school's educational programme;
- advertising and sponsorship arrangements;
- items for personal use on the educational programme;
- in consultation with students, their parents and staff a dress code for students when they are attending or representing the school;

To provide advice to the principal of the school on:

- a general policy concerning the use in school activities of prayers, songs and material based on religious, spiritual or moral values being used in a school activity as part of religious education; and
- the implementation of special religious education under section 69(2) of the School Education Act;

In addition to these powers and duties, a significant role of the School Board is to promote the school within our community.

The School Board cannot:

- intervene in the educational instruction of students
- exercise authority over teaching staff or other persons employed at the school
- intervene in the management or operation of a school.

The School Board generally meets at school once per term commencing at 7:00 pm. If required additional meetings may be called. Meeting dates for 2022 are
