

FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Another busy term draws to an end and like the students; I know the staff are looking forward to a well-deserved break and an opportunity to recharge the batteries. COVID is staring to loosen its grip but has certainly influenced the school over the last term. Apart from a high number of students who have contracted COVID it has also taken its toll on staff. We had 288 relief days, which averages out at approximately five staff members per day. Not all of these are COVID related - some have been Long Service Leave, normal sickness, bereavement leave etc. but it is fair to say from a staffing perspective that Term Two has had its challenges. Despite this, our student have adapted and worked hard to achieve their full potential. As well as some engaging learning programs (Numero, Back to Front Maths, a bigger focus on digital technologies, Talk for Writing, Friendly Schools Plus, Drum beat) they have also participated in Cross Country and had an opportunity to build at the new lego tables or bounce on the new trampolines, all purchased with the 2021 Colour Run money. Thanks to the generosity of the P&C and targeted budgeting from the school, we are in the final stages of planning a library upgrade, which will see new carpet, painting, bookshelves and a range of other furniture. This will create a great new learning environment for our students, which will assist in encouraging a love of reading.

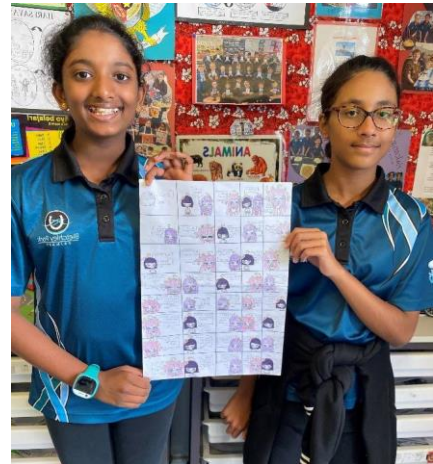

Shaping the future

Applying to enrol your child Kindergarten

Enrolment application process
Once you submit your child's application for enrolment, it will be assessed by the school's principal. In some cases, the school may receive more applications than places available. When this happens, the principal prioritises applications.

First priority

- You and your child live in the school's local-intake area.
- They have a sister or brother enrolled in the same school next year.
- You live nearest to the school.

Second priority

- You and your child live in the school's local-intake area.
- They do not have a sister or brother enrolled in the same school next year.
- You live nearest to the school.

Third priority

- You and your child live outside the local-intake area.
- They have a sister or brother enrolled in the same school next year.
- You live nearest to the school.

Fourth priority

- You and your child live outside the local-intake area.
- They do not have a sister or brother enrolled in the same school next year.
- You live nearest to the school.

Why do I need to apply by the 22 July?
Applications submitted by the deadline form part of the school's first round offers. You can still apply after 22 July, but this may mean that your child misses out on a place.

If your child is not offered a place, the school staff will help you find another school as close to your home as possible.

What do I need to have to apply to enrol my child?

- Your child's birth certificate or identity documents.
- Proof of your child's residential address.
- If your child was born outside Australia or is a temporary resident of Australia, you need their passport, visa and travel documents.
- You need to tell the school whether your child has an Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) immunisation history statement.

Don't have all these documents right now?
Provide as much information as you can. You should make a time to speak with school staff to let them know what is missing and why you don't have it.

Don't forget. You will need your child's current Australian Immunisation Register Immunisation History Statement if your child is offered a place.

How long does it take?
Contact your child's school if you would like an update on their application.

If your child's school doesn't have a local-intake area, the principal will prioritise applications from those that live nearest to the school to those living furthest from the school.
