

FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

I trust those lucky enough to have some time off over the recent school holidays enjoyed the break. The time couldn't have come at a better time for staff, as we were all becoming a little COVID fatigued, but like the true professionals they all are, they met the challenges head on and ensured we provided as much continuity to teaching and learning programs as possible. Once again, we appreciate the communities support in keeping students' home if they are unwell and adhering to guidelines set out by the Health Department.

Attendance has almost (at this stage) returned to normal patterns, which is very pleasing to see for staff, students and I am sure parents. Regular attendance is one of the criteria that certainly assists students to achieve their full potential. A reminder that parents need to provide a reason for a student's absence.

I would like to welcome a number of new staff to BPPS for this term. Ms Leanne Ferguson joins us in LA 21 whilst Mrs Oliver takes up a position in Port Hedland. Very shortly Mrs Clark will be going on parental leave and her two days a week in LA 32 will be filled by Fatemeh Alfouji. Mrs Roberts is taking LA 15 for six weeks whilst Mrs Davies is on LSL. Approximately 85% of the teaching staff have now had COVID and we will not be impacted too severely by a second wave.

Term Three is traditionally one of the busiest terms in a school with 2022 being no exception. Our Yr 4's have recently completed the PEAC placement assessment. We had a P&C dress up day today (Thursday 28th July) and swimming lessons commence next Week for Yr 3-6 followed by two weeks for our PP – Yr3 students. We also have a number of sporting events occurring including a Football Carnival for our Yr 6 girls, Inter school cross country as well as athletics carnivals at BPPS. We also have a Science incursion which the school is funding as well as Book Week activities.

We also have a Parent Open afternoon planned for Wednesday 21st September.

We continue on our Digital Technology journey and recently held a meeting with the current Yr 4 parents to outline our plans and reasoning about going down a 1:1 Bring Your Own iPad program moving forward. If you have any questions or would like to provide any feedback, please contact either one of the Yr 4 teachers or a member of the Leadership Team in the office on 9234 6400. The document we handed to parent at the meeting is available on the school web site under the community tab. In term 4 we have booked a parent session with Paul Litherland on Wed 9th Nov commencing at 6:30pm around cyber safety and an incursion for a number of our year levels around the same topic.

Over the holidays Seesaw updated its platform and provided different icons which has caused some confusion for staff and parents. Parents can still respond to a teacher's message as they did in the past. The version the school is currently using does not allow parents to initiate a personal conversation with the teacher.

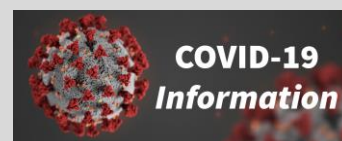

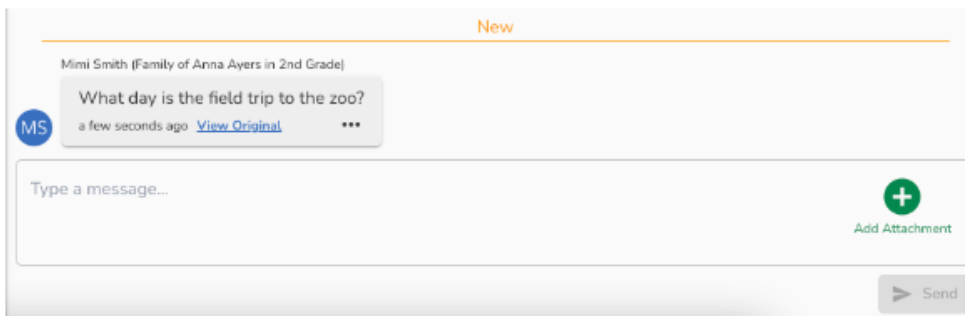

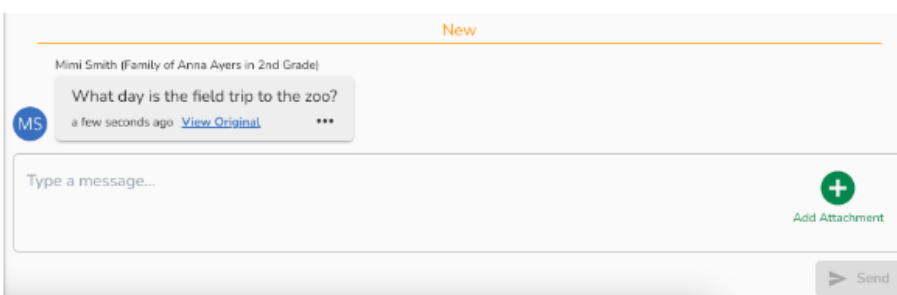

CAHDS are offering a parent information session at Communicare Cannington. The information session is intended for parents with children/adolescents who experience significant attention difficulties, including a diagnosis of ADHD. The information session topic we will be presenting are:

Communication

Presented by CAHDS Senior Speech Pathologist

This workshop aims to provide information to parents about:

- communication difficulties (verbal, written and social) as related to ADHD
- the impact of communication difficulties both diagnosed and undiagnosed

Social connectedness refers to the relationships people have with others. Social connectedness is integral to wellbeing. People are defined by their social roles, whether as partners, parents, children, friends, caregivers, teammates, staff or employers, or many other roles. We are connected by the way we communicate with others, including our use of social media and technologies.

Communication skills, both verbal and written, are needed for individuals to build and maintain relationships with others. Developmental language difficulties/disorders and specific learning difficulties/disorders are common in individuals diagnosed with ADHD but are often undiagnosed. Difficulties can lead to or be a part of attentional, behavioural, emotional and academic difficulties.

If parents are interested in attending this session, they will need to register their attendance as places are limited. Please contact Communicare Cannington on parenting@communicare.org.au to register for the session.

Relevant handouts will be provided at the session. There is no cost to attend the session.
