FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Welcome back to Term 2. For those lucky enough to have had some time off over the recent school holidays, Easter break and ANZAC long weekend, I hope you feel a little revitalized and refreshed.

By now, you will be aware of the latest guidelines we are operating under. The biggest changes for primary schools are:

- Masks are no longer mandated, but students and staff may still choose to wear them.
- Social distancing rules no longer apply so parents can enter classrooms
- Changes in close contact guidelines
- Whole school assemblies can commence (see Term planner)

We are still managing staff absences due to COVID and appreciate your understanding. We make every endeavour to try to provide continuity of learning and the same relief teacher, but in the current environment, this is not always possible.

School photos successfully occurred last week. The students looked great and we appreciate the communities support in ensuring students comply with the school dress code. It was also pleasing to see the number of families who took the opportunity to have family photos. These are always a great keepsake and good to pull out at future 18th and 21st celebrations. We look forward to seeing the final product later in the year.

The ANZAC service we held online at the end of last term ran relatively smoothly. I would like to acknowledge the respect that all students showed on this important occasion and the work of Noelle our head girl and Jake our head boy who were masters of ceremony and did a wonderful job.

Next week our Year 3 and 5 students will be participating in the annual NAPLAN assessment. The majority of this occurs online. Whilst we encourage all of our students to 'do their best', this is only one of many assessment tools we utilize to monitor student progress. It is important we try to keep routines as normal as possible and not increase the anxiety for our students. All of our students have had the opportunity to complete practice assessments and are familiar with the online platform used for NAPLAN. Parents can assist in NAPLAN preparation by ensuring their child:

- 1) Gets plenty of sleep
- 2) Has a healthy diet
- 3) Is encouraged to do their best
- 4) Follows normal routines
- 5) Receives encouragement and assessments are discussed in a non-threatening way.

If parents have any questions about NAPLAN, please feel free to contact either your child's teacher or Ms Kylie Salamon in the administration. We look forward to sharing the results with you later in the year when they become available.

Shaping the future

Applying to enrol your child Kindergarten

Enrolment application process

Once you submit your child's application for enrolment, it will be assessed by the school's principal. In some cases, the school may receive more applications than places available. When this happens, the principal prioritises applications.



First priority

- You and your child live in the school's local-intake area.
- in the same school next year.
- You live nearest to the school.



Second priority

- You and your child live in the school's local-intake area.
- They do not have a sister or brother enrolled in the same school next year.
- · You live nearest to the school.



Third priority

- You and your child live outside the local-intake area.
- They have a sister or brother enrolled in the same school next year
- · You live nearest to the school.



Fourth priority

- You and your child live outside the local-intake area.
- They do not have a sister or brother enrolled in the same school next year.
- · You live nearest to the school.

If your child's school doesn't have a local-intake area, the principal will prioritise applications from those that live nearest to the school to those living furthest from the school.

Why do I need to apply by the 22 July?

Applications submitted by the deadline form part of the school's first round offers. You can still apply after 22 July, but this may mean that your child misses out

If your child is not offered a place, the school staff will help you find another school as close to your home as possible.

They have a sister or brother enrolled What do I need to have to apply to enrol my child?

- · Your child's birth certificate or identity documents.
- · Proof of your child's residential address
- If your child was born outside Australia or is a temporary resident of Australia, you need their passport, visa and travel documents.
- · You need to tell the school whether your child has an Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) immunisation history statement.

Don't have all these documents right now?

Provide as much information as you can. You should make a time to speak with school staff to let them know what is missing and why you don't have it.


Don't forget. You will need your child's current Australian Immunisation Register Immunisation History Statement if your child is offered a place.
