

FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Students returned from the long weekend refreshed and we appear to be over the COVID peak, so it is still full steam ahead at BPPS as we enter the final weeks of Term 2.

School Development Day

Staff spent the recent SDD engaging in professional learning related to our Business Plan strategies. All staff had a 90-minute refresher on NUMERO a maths game, which is taught across the school K-Yr6. This session was followed by staff unpacking what Goal Setting and Structured Lessons should look like based on the HITS (High Impact Teaching Strategies) document. Staff then participated in a number of concurrent sessions related to our Digital Technology priority area. It was a very productive day and should strengthen the already high level of teaching that occurs at BPPS.

Digital Technologies 1:1 Devices

One of the strategies in our Business Plan is trialling 1:1 iPads with our Year 4 students. Parents and students were surveyed early in the year to provide the school with some base line data on the trial. We will conduct the survey again in term three to gauge growth. Anecdotal data suggests the trial is been successful with increased student engagement and students strategically using technologies to optimise opportunities in learning, work and manage their well being. Outcomes of the trial may see the school go down the BYO (Bring Your Own Device) pathway. This would mean the school would continue to provide iPads to Yr 4 students in 2023 but the current Yr 4's moving into Yr 5 would need to purchase / bring their own iPad to school in 2023. If this strategy goes ahead, we will be providing more information to parents shortly. If you have any initial questions, please ask one of the Year 4 teachers or a member of the Leadership Team.

Reports

Semester One reports are currently been finalized and will be sent home on Tuesday 28th June (Tuesday of the last week of term). Once again, a reminder that if you have any concerns about the information contained in the report, please make an appointment with the appropriate teacher (including specialists) at a mutually agreeable time.

The formal report is only one tool that the school uses to provide feedback on student progress at BPPS. The parent information sessions held at the beginning of Term 1, the Three Way Conference held online at the end of Term 1 and the parent open afternoon that will be held in Term 3 are some of the other methods used. Staff also use See Saw and parents can meet with staff on request.

Due to COVID and some families taking unauthorized vacations for extended periods of time, staff have not been able to comment or grade on all students in all learning areas.

School Board

The School Board met on Monday night (13th June). We welcomed three new parent / community members to the board Jenny Gay, Alice Nien and Jade Fowler. Items discussed included an update on the implementation of strategies in the Business Plan, On Entry data, review of the schools Behaviour Management policy and the school financial report. 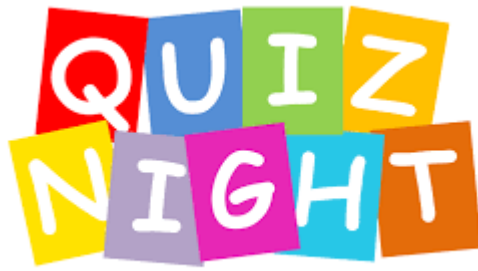

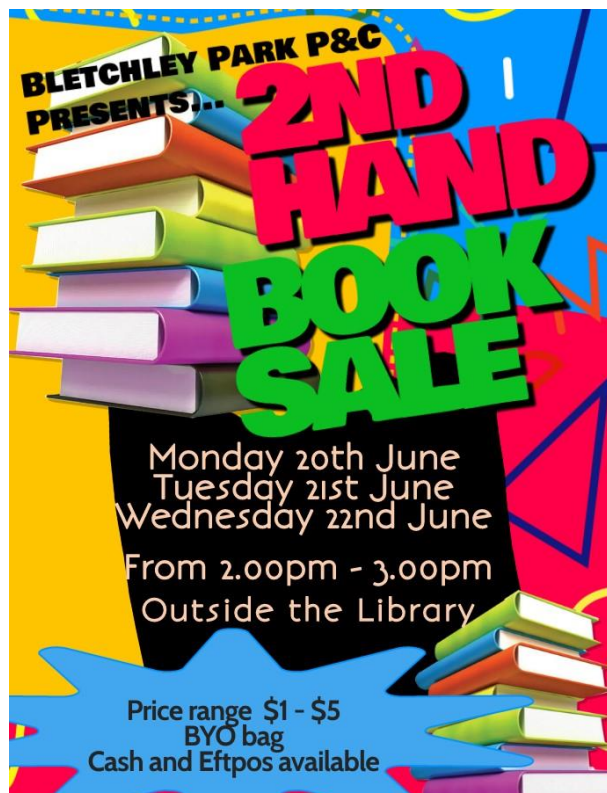

Department of Education Shaping the future

Applying to enrol your child Kindergarten

Enrolment application process

Once you submit your child's application for enrolment, it will be assessed by the school's principal. In some cases, the school may receive more applications than places available. When this happens, the principal prioritises applications.

First priority

- You and your child live in the school's local-intake area.
- They have a sister or brother enrolled in the same school next year.
- You live nearest to the school.

Second priority

- You and your child live in the school's local-intake area.
- They do not have a sister or brother enrolled in the same school next year.
- You live nearest to the school.

Third priority

- You and your child live outside the local-intake area.
- They have a sister or brother enrolled in the same school next year.
- You live nearest to the school.

Fourth priority

- You and your child live outside the local-intake area.
- They do not have a sister or brother enrolled in the same school next year.
- You live nearest to the school.

If your child's school doesn't have a local-intake area, the principal will prioritise applications from those that live nearest to the school to those living furthest from the school.

Why do I need to apply by the 22 July?

Applications submitted by the deadline form part of the school's first round offers. You can still apply after 22 July, but this may mean that your child misses out on a place.

If your child is not offered a place, the school staff will help you find another school as close to your home as possible.

What do I need to have to apply to enrol my child?

- Your child's birth certificate or identity documents.
- Proof of your child's residential address.
- If your child was born outside Australia or is a temporary resident of Australia, you need their passport, visa and travel documents.
- You need to tell the school whether your child has an Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) immunisation history statement.

Don't have all these documents right now?

Provide as much information as you can. You should make a time to speak with school staff to let them know what is missing and why you don't have it.

Don't forget: You will need your child's current Australian Immunisation Register Immunisation History Statement if your child is offered a place.

How long does it take?

Contact your child's school if you would like an update on their application.
