



FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Term three is settling into its own rhythm and our Yr 3-6 students have almost completed their swimming lessons, with PP – Yr 2 swimming commencing from Monday 15th August. To date, swimming has run very smoothly and I am sure students are looking forward to seeing if they have passed to the next level. A reminder to our PP – Yr 2 students to please make sure all swimming items are clearly labelled.

Next week sees the start of Science Week. Our junior students have already participated in some activities including a school funded science incursion this week due to swimming. Our great science teachers (Mrs Lumsden, Mrs Davey and Mrs Browning) have organised a range of activities and students in Yrs 4-6 will participate in the science incursion next week. We were also lucky enough to receive some additional funding from the government in 2021, which has allowed us to build our physical resources in this space.

Over the past few weeks, we have had an increase in the number of students coming to school late. For a small percentage, this is a regular occurrence. Students entering a classroom late can be embarrassing for the student and can disrupt the running of lessons eg instructions having to be repeated. If a child is 5 min late per day they lose 25 min of learning a week, 250 min a term and 1000 min over the year (16.5 hours / 3 days). This obviously has an impact on a child's learning and that of others in the room. We encourage students to arrive at BPPS between 8:15 am and 8:30am when classrooms are open. Student who arrive early (definitely not before 8:00am) need to assemble at UCA so that they can be appropriately supervised. We appreciate the support of parents and students moving forward. Playground equipment in ALL areas of the school is not to be used by students before or after school even if parents are present. Your support in addressing these two areas would be greatly appreciated.

A reminder to parent that our next School Development Day will be on Monday 29th August. Students do not attend school on this day. Staff will be engaged in a number of PL activities and unpacking some of our student data.

In a few weeks we will also be providing parents, staff and student the opportunity to provide some feedback about Bletchley Park PS. We will be sending out links to the National School Opinion Survey shortly so parents can complete a short online survey. We will also be having iPads available at assemblies and during the parent open afternoon on Wednesday 21st September. We will be encouraging as many parents as possible to complete the survey as this will make the data more reliable.

Hopefully you have seen the advertising Posters about the up coming P&C Quiz night for adults. The P&C are working very hard to organise this event and have already secured some great prizes. The Quiz night will be held at BPPS on Friday 16th September. Details on how to purchase tickets can be found in this newsletter.

Our next School Board Meeting is on Tuesday 30th August commencing at 7:00pm at BPPS. This meeting is open to the school community to attend.

Last week we celebrated the diverse background of students at our school. In Indonesian lessons, students from Year 3 to Year 6, shared the languages spoken at home and the countries they come from. During the week, there were daily activities in the Indonesian Room at recess or lunch time. Students had the opportunity to make their own name badge to represent another language or learn another language using Languages Online on the iPads.


