



### Science Incursion

#### Science

In 2022, the world observes the United Nations International Year of Glass, celebrating one of the most important, versatile and transformative materials of history. Glass has many applications in our lives today but, as it is infinitely recyclable, it will have an enormous impact in our sustainable future.



Glass is made by heating and mixing silica (quartz sand) with limestone, soda ash and other ingredients, to a temperature of 1500°C. This changes the solid materials to a liquid, which can be poured, shaped and cooled to form glass for windows, bottles, jars etc.

This term in science students are studying chemical sciences which looks at materials and change of state. In junior and middle science students have been learning about the effects of adding and removing heat from different substances and recycling materials. In senior science students have linked their scientific knowledge of change of state to the recycling process.

Recycling glass is important for sustainability, as it decreases the need to make new glass and less glass goes to landfill. Recycled glass can be crushed into glass sand which allows it to be reprocessed not only into glass products but also construction projects for roads and concrete.

Glass can also be made naturally;

Obsidian

When lightning strikes beach sand, glass structures called fulgurites can be formed. When lava cools quickly it can form volcanic glass called obsidian.









