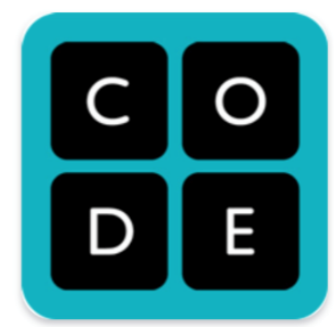


Vocabulary

2D and 3D Shapes

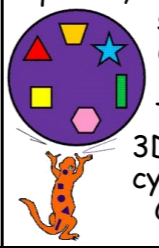
How many 2D and 3D shapes can you name?

Think of a way you can do something Kind for someone else.

Write or draw about how it made you feel to "sprinkle" some kindness around".

WRITE A LETTER TO A FRIEND, GRANDPARENT OR AN AUNT OR UNCLE.

TELL THEM WHAT YOU ARE DOING DURING YOUR DAY AND ASK THEM TO TELL YOU ABOUT THEIRS.

Can you solve this problem?

There are three baskets, a brown one, a red one and a pink one, holding a total of 10 eggs. Can you use the information given to find out how many eggs are in each basket?

How many answers did you get?

Hint; you might need to find three containers and 10 of something to model the question.

Food Art

Draw a picture of your favourite food. Be sure to add texture!

Start with three pairs of socks

Now mix them up so that no mismatched pair is the same as another mismatched pair.

Now try it with four pairs of socks. Is there more than one way to do it?

Book Review

Write a book review of your favourite book. You need to tell the reader why you like it; talk about the characters and convince them to read it. You can do an illustration of your favourite part.

Card Games

Play card games with a member of your family. Try number facts, snap, snap +/-, Numero or make 10.
